Jim Barry is the Managing Director of Barry Group, one of Ireland's most respected wholesale distribution groups. The company employs over 230 people at its state of the art headquarters in Mallow, Co. Cork. Under Jim's vision and leadership, Barry Group has grown from a once local business to a leading wholesale distribution company. Trading both nationally and internationally and supplying over 1,000 customers; Barry Group manages 265 franchises under the Costcutter, Carry Out Off Licence, and Quik Pick symbols. Jim was listed as a finalist in the EY, Entrepreneur of the year awards in 2010. Barry Group was listed as one of Deloitte's Best Managed Companies in 2010 and has been reaccredited every year since then. Barry Group was named as a Great Place To Work in 2015 and Jim was honoured to be named 'Irelands Most Trusted Leader' at the 2015 Great Place To Work Awards.



Ana Barjasic started collaborating with EBAN and AAIA - Austrian Angel Investors Association in Vienna in 2013, and then moved to Brussels to be the Business Angels Week (BAW) Coordinator. In its three editions and under her supervision, BAW became the world's largest initiative on promoting angel and early stage investment, with over 600 events in 55 countries. Bruce Clibborn has been an active angel investor with Ireland-based angel investment syndicate Boole Investments for the past 4 years. In his early career he served in various capacities for cloud storage technology company Raidtec, ultimately as a director of Raidtec USA Inc. leading the subsidiary through a management buyout and subsequent sale to FTSE-listed Plasmon plc [LSE:PLM]. Prior to founding Venlake Management Services, he worked in analyst and acquisitions roles in the investment industry at Grosvenor Group Ltd and STAG Capital Partners Ltd. At Venlake he provides business strategy advice and management expertise to SME clients in Germany, the UK and Ireland. Bruce graduated with a BA in Electronic and Microelectronic Engineering from Trinity College Dublin, holds the Investment Management Certificate from the Chartered Financial Institute and has an MBA in Finance from the London Business School.



Brian Clune is an Angel Investor and Consultant Engineer with over 20 years experience in providing automation and project management expertise to the Life Sciences Industry. Previously Brian held a variety of technical and management roles with engineering services company ProsCon Ltd based in Cork. He was part of a management buy out and subsequent sale of ProsCon Ltd to US multinational Rockwell Automation. Brian has been involved in a number of investments in start up companies through Boole Investments in Cork. In conjunction with EI, VC's and other business angels, he has lead Boole investments in sectors including, Software as a Service (SAS), Food, Medical Device, Technology and Internet of Things (IOT).



Julian Costley is an active investor in technology and media companies and serves as a chairman or non-executive director on a number of boards. He has just been commissioned to write a book on crowd funding. He was a Country Manager at Thomson Reuters, before creating his own TV channel on BSB (later BSkyB), then CEO of France Telecom's Globecast satellite company. After meeting venture capitalist Hermann Hauser in 1998, they created E*TRADE UK, the UK's first all-Internet stockbroking firm and effected a trade sale at the height of the dotcom boom. Since then he has invested in 16 companies and became chairman/NED or adviser to many more focusing on the telecoms, media, financial services, and internet markets in UK, Netherlands, Scandinavia, France, Canada and China. He is an occasional lecturer/mentor/MBA course judge at London Business School, Said (Oxford University), EDHEC (Nice), UM (Barcelona), Skema Business School (Sophia Antipolis) and Deusto (San Sebastian).



JIM COSTELLO, Chairman SouthWestern, spent 15 years in the Information Technology and Outsourcing Sectors in Ireland and internationally. He was Finance Director for Unisys Corporation in Europe, General Manager of Managed Services in France and Global Managing Director of the Unisys/Dell Managed Services Alliance. In 2003 he joined SouthWestern where 35 staff were working exclusively on IT processing for the Department of Agriculture. Since then, the company, led by Jim as CEO, has grown through the delivery of true value-add to all existing and new customers, in Ireland and beyond. In 2007, SouthWestern opened its first international operations centre in Lodz, Poland, then, in 2011 the UK centre was opened. In 2014, SouthWestern was sold to Capita in the UK for €35m. Jim's career has been involved in delivering "mission critical" solutions for large and major customers around the world, where excellent service has always been the benchmark. Jim studied Business Excellence models in University of Ulster and Stanford University, California and currently is Chairman of Compliance & Risks.



SHEMAS EIVERS is co-founder and Managing Partner of Avnet Client Solutions, which was acquired by Horizon in 2001 and subsequently by Avnet in 2008. He is now in his 20th year leading the team in Avnet Client Solutions and has recently been working with Ascendant EMEA to merge the best traits of both organisations. He previously worked as a research engineer at the National Microelectronics Research Centre and was co-founder of Software Manufacturing Consultants Limited where his role progressed from Technical Director to Managing Director before selling the company to Kentz Technologies. He has founded several other businesses over the years ranging from Video shops and Karting tracks to Investments funds. Shemas holds a Masters Degree in Civil Engineering from University College Cork. He is also co-founder and chairman of the National Software Centre in Ireland (birthplace of the Coder Dojo movement) and a co-founder of IT@Cork. In 2007 Shemas was one of five people given an IT Pioneer award by the Irish Computer Society.

Ted Foley has worked with a number of companies including KPMG, Revenue Commissioners and the Industrial Credit Corporation (ICC). Following 8 years with ICC, Ted joined AIB Bank in 1988. In AIB he held a number of Senior Management positions, initially working in AIB's Capital Markets Division with responsibility for setting up the Bank's investment management operation in the West of Ireland. Regional Director for Cork and the South West. Co- Founded OmniVend, a successful network, revenue and service management company. Declan is actively involved with a number of high achieving early stage technology companies assisting them scale internationally.



Charles Garvey is CEO of Metabolomic Diagnostics, an innovative medical diagnostics company developing technologies for the early detection of a woman's risk of complications during her pregnancy. From 1990 to 2003 Charles was CEO of Horizon Technology Group which started life as a small Apple Computer reseller in Cork and grew into a large pan European IT group, listed on the Dublin and London stock exchanges and completing 13 acquisitions and disposals along the way. At its peak the group was worth over €1Bn and employed 720 people in 5 countries through 13 separate companies. The company was eventually sold to Avnet Inc in 2008. Charles was also previously CEO (now chairman) of NitroSell, an eCommerce company focussed on web enabling bricks and mortar retailers, predominantly in the USA. NitroSell's technology seamlessly integrates instore and online systems and has enabled their retailers to generate close to \$1Billion in online sales to date.



Paul Hands is a successful serial entrepreneur with passion and experience to help companies succeed through strategic vision and uncanny insight into business challenges and opportunities. Paul has successfully completed funding rounds over the past fifteen years with numerous national and international investment companies and organizations.
